You are probably aware that the Health Department established at the request of the School Board, a system of physical inspection of children, which has been submitted to with comparatively no protest, until this month when the enclosed two letters were received from Dr. Manger by the School Examiner. One of the children was excluded by the Medical Examiner for not submitting to the usual physical examination, but she was subsequently permitted to return to school by me until the legal status of the school examination was established by your opinion.
