I, therefore, think that the trouble should be remedied as far as possible by compelling the Kennedy Estate to, at once, clean out the drain and put it in proper repair, and that steps should then be taken by the City to make some adequate provision to take care of the flow of water at this point.

Before acting upon this opinion, I wish you would kindly refer it to Mr. Lauchheimer. Mr. Lauchheimer has in charge an important damage case, arising out of a similar condition somewhat further up on Jenkins Lane. He has, therefore, considered the same question, and I do not want to take any position which might, in any way, interfere with any position he may take in his damage case.
