I herewith enclose copy of a report from Mr. Ritchie, in connection with the questions arising out of the protest from Charles Herzog, attorney and agent on account of the assessments made by you against the property owners in the grading, curbing and paving of Rose street.

Kindly be guided by the advice contained in the concluding paragraphs of Mr. Ritchie's letter. As to what answer you should make to the protest it seems to me that all you need say to Mr. Herzog is that you have been advised by the Law Department that the ordinance in question is legal and that the assessment by the front foot rule is also legal.
