Replying to your favor of September 30th, asking for the definition of a livery stable as the same appears in paragraph 12 of Section 47 of the New Building Code, I beg to advise you as follows:

~~A livery stable is a place where horses or vehicles are kept or let for hire.~~ The case you mention seems to me to come within the purview of this definition as the owners contemplate the letting of their horses and vehicles for hire.
