As requested by your favor of October 20th, I have considered the School Board's inquiry of October 19th, together with the enclosures. Vivian Riley has been attending the public schools, giving her residence as Jackson street. It develops, however, that both of her parents live in Cumberland and that the child's grandmother lives on Jackson street. Under these circumstances, I do not think that the child is entitled to go to the public schools of Baltimore.
