that have arisen in connection with the widening and changing of the grade of the Liberty Road from the Western Maryland Railroad tracks to Ninth avenue. I understand that your Board is willing, acting as the Annex Improvement Commission, to take possession of the Liberty Road, between the points mentioned, for the purpose of grading and widening the same, provided you receive a letter from me to the effect that you have the legal right so to do.

In my opinion you are fully authorized by the provisions of Chapter 274 of the Acts of 1904, to do the work in question, the Liberty Road, between the points mentioned, being a public street of the City of Baltimore, and being situated in the Annex.
