Dear Sir:-

6876 Replying to your favor of December 7th, relative to the paving of Payson street which is already partly paved, I beg to advise you that, in my opinion, your interpretation of the Anti-Cobble-stone Ordinance is correct. You have no right to use cobble stones on public streets except in repairing existing cobble stone streets. I would, therefore, advise you to go ahead and use vitrified brick on Payson street.
