that Mr. Jones will be subject to the penalty prescribed by Section 107.

In addition to this, Mr. Jones in paving the street was, of course, a mere trespasser. As the work has been improperly done by him, he can be notified by Mr. Fendall to restore the street to its former and proper condition at his own expense, and if he does not comply with such notice, then the City can do this work and charge it to Mr. Jones.
