OPINION.

Dear Sir:-

I have considered the letter of Mr. Hendrick to you dated December 21st, in reference to the extra work to be done in connection with the foundations of the Sewage Pumping Station. Mr. Hendrick explained to me in person, the various matters and informed me that, in his judgment as an engineer, the driving of the piles was "an addition to or alteration in" the work and therefore is clearly within Section 10, page 9 of the specifications and this work can be let and paid for in the manner prescribed by Section 10.

It seems to me that the work contemplated is rather within Section 10, page 9, than Section 53 page 24, but this is an engineering problem and if it is extra work, then it may be paid for in the manner prescribed by Section 53, page 24, or by Section 10, page
