Dear Sir:-

The Sewerage Commission will be pleased to receive from you an opinion on the subject of the authority of the Inspector of Public Building, in connection with the construction of the foundations for the Sewerage Pumping Station.

In connection therewith, your attention is invited to a copy of a letter written to His Honor, the Mayor, by the Chief Engineer on December 12, 1908, in which the question of the necessity for sinking concrete piles for the foundation was considered.

The statements of Mr. Hendrick in the letter to the Mayor concerning the necessity and the greatly increased cost of the concrete piling are approved and adopted by the Commission.

It is estimated that the increased cost in the construction of the building, due to the installation of the concrete piling down!
