feet to bring the pike to the established grade.

The property immediately south of the park and abutting on the east side of the Reisterstown pike is now being developed by some very handsome dwellings, and we want to pave some of the streets in that locality to bring the property under the full rate of taxation. If we bring the streets to grade, when we reach the turnpike there will be no approach from that road unless the pike is brought to the established grade.

This road is one of the roads that has been tentatively selected by the State Roads Commission to be improved out of the State Loan. We believe this is the time to take the matter up and have the grade physically established on this pike as well as on all the pikes within the City limits.

We hope you will be able to give us this information as soon as possible, as we want to take this matter up at once.
