Referring to our conversation of this morning, I hand you herewith a letter from Mr. Manning, together with a sketch showing the situation at Broadway. We agreed, in that conversation, that the ordinance directing the parking of Broadway would have considerable bearing on this case, and, at my request and suggestion, you said that you would have this matter investigated.

The point at issue is whether I shall maintain, as a sidewalk, a strip in length equal to the width of the parking and in width equal to the width of an ordinary city sidewalk.
