which order is not quite clear to us.

If we understand the situation correctly, the pole in question is not in the way of sewer construction at this point, and that you order its removal for other purposes, to wit, to accommodate location of a gas lamp. We do not understand that it is within the power of your Commission to order the removal of a pole for such purposes, and we would therefore ask you to further advise us, as we may not clearly understand the situation.

Replying to your letter of the 23rd, regarding the pole at the northwest corner of Chase street and Collington avenue, which we requested be removed, I beg to say that your understanding is correct, that the pole itself is not directly in the way of our construction work, but the removal is necessary in order that the place now occupied by this pole may be used for a gas lamp which now occupies the location of our proposed inlet. In order that the scheme of lighting adopted by the Superintendent of Lamps and Lighting may be maintained, it will be necessary for that department to place the gas lamp referred to in the place now occupied by your pole.
