Dear Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 24th, with further reference to pole at the northwest corner of Chase street and Collington avenue, and note that the pole itself is not directly in the way of your construction work.

To relocate the pole, as specified in your notice of February 18th, would not provide proper support for our existing wires at this point, and an additional pole would have to be erected. On the other hand, the pole as now located, is in line with the ultimate arrangement of our wires at this point, and we would very much dislike to abandon the location unless absolutely necessary.

I note that in order that the scheme of lighting adopted by the Superintendent of Lamps and Lighting may be maintained, it will be necessary for that department to place the gas lamp referred to in the place now occupied by our pole, and we will therefore defer changes at this point until further advice from the Superintendent of Lamps and Lighting.
