Replying to your favor of April 3rd, in reference to the laying of pavements in the Burnt District, I beg to say that lot No. 18 South Frederick street, referred to by you, seems to me to be a good lot upon which to make a test case.

As I understand the situation, a notice similar in form to the one that you enclosed with your letter, has been served upon Martien & Co., the agents of the owner, and more than ten days have elapsed and as yet no steps have been taken to repave the sidewalk, in accordance with the terms of the notice.

There is no reason why you should not now have this work done at the expense of the property owner, send the bill to the property owner, or his agent, and upon his refusal to pay it we can institute suit.
