I have received an application from Mr. Hanline for permit for machinery to manufacture paints.

Section 47, Paragraph 12, limits the location of such buildings. Paragraph 13 requires advertisement before permit can be granted.

Mr. Hanline claims that this law does not apply to his place, inasmuch as there is no new building to be erected. I have stated to him that while the building in which he is going to locate in is an old building, yet the plant he proposes to establish is a new construction, and, therefore, within the scope of the law, in my judgment. Kindly advise me if I am correct.
