In the new Traffic Ordinance there is a very unfortunate provision which permits people to drive across sidewalks and curbs to reach their property.

There is an alley parallel with Twenty-fifth Street, between Maryland Avenue and Hudson Alley, where no provision has been made to get from Maryland Avenue across the sidewalk into this alley, and as a natural consequence, the sidewalk is being destroyed.

I took the matter up with the Police Department, as will appear from the attached correspondence. Is there anything you can suggest which the City might do in order to protect its curb and to secure a proper sort of sidewalk in front of this alley, from the building line of Maryland Avenue to the curb line thereof.

I shall thank you to return the enclosed correspondence with your reply.
