7729      Referring further to our correspondence with regard to the alley in the rear of 100 to 116 Twenty-fifth Street, between Maryland Avenue and Hudson Alley, and Mr. Wright's report thereon, copy of which you sent me June 1st, I am sorry to say that I am still a little in doubt as to how to proceed.

I assume that the alley in question is an alley laid out for use in common by the owners of the property fronting on Twenty-fifth Street, and I also assume that by first serving a notice on them to put the crossing in shape, and in the event of their neglect or failure to do so, I may do what is necessary and assess them with the cost.
