7748 Please find enclosed a letter from Mr. Alonso M. Hurlock, which was sent to this Department in order to set forth the legal points that he considers of importance in claiming the right to make additional use of Mr. Fardwell's drain without a permit from the owner of the drain.

This Department declined to give Mr. Hurlock permission to make additional use of Mr. Fardwell's sewer without first obtaining a permit from Mr. Fardwell. Mr. Hurlock claimed that there was nothing in law requiring us to do so. My reply was that even if there was nothing in the law to require it, yet to me it was obviously wrong to grant him a permit to go into a sewer owned by some one else.
