As requested by your favor of June 22nd, I have considered the Mayor's inquiry, contained in his letter to you of June 21st, wherein he asks whether the premiums on the bonds required of the Commissioners for Opening Streets should be paid by the City or by the Commissioners, themselves.

On March 21st 1908, (Office File No. 2690) City Solicitor Bruce rendered an opinion to Mr. Quick, as follows:
