Mr. Benjamin Glenn, contractor, has asked the Harbor Board for a permit to construct a pier north from a line marked Port Warden's Line of 1834 (please find blue-print attached) on the lines as marked north 26 degrees 16 minutes east and south 24 degrees 16 minutes west, about a distance of 130 feet. This work to be done in front of the Grebbs property, as laid out in yellow line.

The owners of the property west of the Grebbs property marked Pratt, seem to contend that they have the right to extend the east line of their property marked north 44 degrees 41 minutes east, the same line being the west property line of the Grebbs property, in a straight line from Webster street and the intersection with the Port
