I have your favor of January 4th, and had acted on the line of your suggestion before receiving your letter, which, I assume, should have been dated "February 4th". For your further information, I am sending you a copy of my letter to Mr. Hood replying to his letter of February 3rd, copy of which letter is also enclosed, which, I think, sets forth very clearly the fact that the price I have charged him for this pavement is lower than the lowest figure named by contractors for Vitrified Brick paving. The work which we did for Mr. Hood, being in his tracks, is, in the nature of things, more costly than the work which the contractors propose to do at a price four cents above the price we have charged Mr. Hood's Company.
