I understand that City Surveyors have been determining a grade today on the alley in the rear of my premises, 2104 Fifteenth street, Walbrook.

In anticipation of action thereon by the City I desire respectfully to inform your office, and herewith do so as follows:

I bought my property 2104 Fifteenth street before any alterations had been commenced in any part of the said alley in the rear. I have always desired and do desire to have the said alley in its condition, as at the time of said purchase.

It cannot legally be changed therefrom or maintained in its present condition of change without my consent which has not been given, nor will it be given.

Furthermore, to raise the level of said alley will make my premises a marsh and a drainage surface for adjacent property. In that case I notify you now that I shall seek damage compensation from this City by law.
