The Law specifically provides that this question is one for the determination of the jury or of the Court, acting as a jury, and I, therefore, think it clear that in each case the extent to which employers must permit the use of the seats provided is one for determination by the Court or Jury, and will be decided in accordance with the circumstances of each case.
