the consent of the Supervisors of City Charities. In the present case, however, Margaret Downs appears not to have any contagious disease.

After conferring with the State's Attorney, I beg to advise you that the proper course would seem to be for the Health Commissioner to swear out a warrant against Margaret Downs for maintaining a nuisance. She can then be paroled, on condition that she go to Bay View, and sentence can be suspended so long as she remains there.
