I enclose herewith a copy of certain correspondence, dated June 1907, with regard to one M.J. Kelly, a foreman for one of our contractors; also copies of interviews, of recent date, which I had with certain of our contractors regarding complaints from the laborers employed on the work.

I also enclose a copy of a letter addressed by me, under date of April 2nd, to my Division Engineers, which was based on my opinion, formed from the past record of this man and my recent investigation regarding the charge of extortion, that this man would be detrimental to the work of the Commission if allowed to continue on it. I enclose a copy of the specifications, on page 11 of which I have marked the clause under which my action was taken.

I am now in receipt of the enclosed letter from Mr. Michael Kelly, dated April 11th, from which it would appear that it is his intention to take some further action in this matter.
