and found that the foreman had not looked out for the safety of the work since the heavy rain of the previous evening.

This morning I again visited the place and found that, contrary to my explicit directions, sheeting had not been driven in advance of the work, and that pipe had been laid where the sheeting was only partially driven down and the bottom of the sheeting above the bottom of the excavation.

In addition to the complaints above referred to, he is guilty of the use of profanity to a very large extent, both to his men and to our inspector, and I feel that should be prohibited in a public place like this.

In view of these facts, I feel that this man has no intention to follow the directions of the Engineers and Inspector, and that his further presence on the work is injurious and that he should be removed.
