Mr. Hendrick - "Mr. Connet, I have asked you to come here on account of a complaint that came to me yesterday through Otto Jackowitz, who represents these two laborers, who he says have been working for David Peoples at Lombard and Wolfe streets, under foreman Mike Kelley. He informs me that this foreman has demanded from these men \$1.00 a week."

Jackowitz: "They say he took that dollar from them each week and when Saturday came around he would say to them that he had no money and wanted a drink, and would make them spend a quarter on drinks for him. This man has been working for the Company for two years. From the beginning the foreman did not take so much, - he took a dollar once in a while - but lately he has not been satisfied with a dollar but wants more than a dollar every week. After he discharged these men they said they demanded their time and their money, and he would not
