Gentlemen:-

Your letter of December 27th, addressed to the Chief Engineer, has been referred to the Sewerage Commission. In this letter you ask whether or not it is the intention of the Sewerage Commission to take advantage of the clause in the New Sewerage Enabling Act as passed by the last session of the General Assembly, to incorporate into the Sewerage System any private drains which they feel can be properly incorporated. I would say that it is the intention of the Commission to do so. Further, the Commission have authorized an advertisement to appear in the papers covering the information necessary for them to have regarding private drains.

Regarding the particular drains in Lateral District 34-A, Sanitary Contract No. 57, on inquiry it is reported to me by the Chief Engineer that the only information you gave us was certain dotted lines placed by you on a map furnished by the Engineering Department, showing the streets and alleys in this district in which your drains
