are laid, no information as to location, size, or depth being given. On December 23rd, after the contract was let and the work under way, you furnished further information.

The representative of the Engineering Department who secured this information, informed you at the time that it was inadequate to allow us to make a proper study of your drains in relation to the new sewers. From further information which the engineering department has been able to obtain outside of your office, they find there are several of your drains in this district which may possibly be incorporated into the Sewerage System. The construction of certain sewers is being deferred, pending a final decision as to the incorporation of these drains. The Commission will advise you regarding this matter later. The funds for the purchase of private drains will, as you know, only become available upon the passage of the next loan.

We sincerely hope that the owners of private drains will cooperate with us in securing this information, so that we can study it before letting our contracts.
