CORRESPONDENCE.

The drain in Twentieth street, west of Homewood avenue, and also in Greenmount avenue were laid out ten years ago, and the balance of all drains shown on plans were laid since 1906; that is they were started in 1906 and extended at various times up to last year.

We have not granted permission to owners of any property shown to discharge storm-water into our drains.

We would like to have a reply as soon as possible, advising whether or not you will take over and incorporate into the sanitary system any of the drains shown on plan, and if so kindly let us know which drains you will incorporate into said system.
