With reference to the drains shown on the blueprint enclosed with their letter of the 17th, the Commission is considering the possibility of utilizing the drain in the alley north of North avenue, from the alley east of Homewood avenue to the alley east of Hope street; the drain in the alley east of Homewood avenue, from Twentieth street to the alley north of North avenue; the drain in the alley south of Twentieth street, from Homewood avenue to the alley west of Homewood avenue, and the drain in the alley west of Homewood avenue, from the alley south of Twentieth street to the alley north of North avenue, - the total length of these drains being about 2,000 feet. The remainder of the drains shown on the blueprint, amounting to about 1,300 feet, do not appear to meet the requirements from an engineering standpoint.

I refer this matter to the Commission for their consideration and such decision as they deem proper.
