I return the franchise permit No. 1844, which accompanied your letter of the 26th, relating to the two drop awnings at the northwest corner of Columbia avenue and Emory street.

I know of no provision of law that requires that awnings erected outside of the Burnt District shall be at least ten feet high above the sidewalk. I notice, however, that the franchise permit in question calls for a height of ten feet.
