Please find enclosed a letter from the Sewerage Commission enclosing a copy of one submitted by Mr. Calvin W. Hendrick, Chief Engineer of the Sewerage Commission, concerning the giving of temporary relief to the region for which the sewer is being constructed, by allowing the sewage to flow into Peck's Branch. You probably remember that Dr. Jones, the Assistant Commissioner of Health, called on you a few days ago and explained that the disposal plant on the park property would not be finished until next Fall, but that it is highly desirable that the property should be connected up, as the main sewer now being constructed by the Sewerage Commission is finished. As soon as the disposal plant is finished then of course all drainage into Peck's Branch from this sewer will be separated. Will you please at your earliest convenience give me your opinion on the right of the Health Department to give the required permits.
