On September 2nd, 1910, Mr. Wright, then acting as City Solicitor, sent you an opinion in reference to the obligation of Mr. Richard B. Tippet to fill up his sidewalk on Tenth street between North avenue and Chesapeake avenue.

After the giving of this opinion Mr. Tippet endeavored to have it modified, and saw me in reference thereto. I have read all the papers and considered the matter afresh, but see no reason to change the opinion of Mr. Wright, and, therefore, advise you that Mr. Tippet is subject to the City Ordinances and should be compelled to comply therewith.

Inasmuch as Mr. Tippet may resist, it is desirable that the notices sent to him be strictly in compliance with the law, so that they may be made the basis of the proper action. Will you kindly advise me whether you are proceeding according to Sections 20, 21 and 22, or Section 28, of Article 35, of the Baltimore City Code of 1906?
