Dear Sir:-

9377 Replying to your favor of August 10th relative to the application of Mr. Hood to lay a certain piece of track on Union avenue, marked in red on the accompanying sketch, I beg to advise you that I cannot see under what authority you could grant the permit requested. Perhaps Mr. Hood may be able to refer you to the Ordinance under which the existing spur of track from Falls Road to Union avenue was laid, and it may be that that Ordinance contains language which would authorize the extension now desired. Otherwise it will be necessary for the Company to secure an Ordinance.
