Gentlemen:-

We beg to refer to yours of July 13th, in reference to sewer connections from our building to the new Sewerage System now in course of construction under your supervision.

If it meets with your approval we should like to have the connection follow the same plan as at present in use, viz: run a pipe down the alley in the rear of our premises and connect with the sewer at the building line on Pratt Street. The pipe now in use carries both storm water and sewage and it is used in common by ourselves and
