the two abutting properties at the respective corners of Pratt Street and aforesaid alley. We wish, if agreeable, to allow the present pipe to remain but to divert from it all sewage and use it only as a storm water drain. A new pipe will then be laid for sewage exclusively and will be used in common by ourselves and the two properties above mentioned.

Relative to the three properties combining in the common use of the one sewage drain in the alley, beg to advise that we have consulted the Inspector of Plumbing (your letter suggested the necessity of his permission) and after explaining that our property as well as each of the other two properties would have individual connections with the drain, he said he saw no reason why the common use of the one pipe would be objected to.

If foregoing plan has your sanction we shall await your further pleasure as to when the work of laying the pipe and connecting with the sewer shall be undertaken.
