Federal St. from Milton Ave. to Luzerne St. is partly paved with cobble and partly unpaved. The tracks are paved with cobble and two foot outside thereof. The curbs are in, together with the gutters, and a narrow strip of paving along the gutters. I should say that about 60% of the street is paved, leaving about 40% unpaved. I may have enough money left in my Emergency Fund to close this area out with cobble this year. In view of the "Anti-Cobble Ordinance", would I be justified in closing this street out with cobble stone which I now have on hand?

The street is in quite a state of nuisance and something should be done to relieve the condition.
