OPINION.

Dear Sir:-

9401 I reply, as follows, to your favor of the 11th, relative to the permit to be issued by you to the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company, in connection with the conduits proposed to be laid by said Company in the Frederick Road:

As a solution of the difficulty, I would suggest that a permit, of the character that accompanied your letter to me of the 11th, be issued to the Telephone Company, and that the following clause be attached thereto:

9402 It is hereby understood and agreed that the issuing of this permit, and its acceptance by the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company, shall, in no wise, be construed as an admission by said Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company that the rentals prescribed by Ordinance No. 41, approved May 9, 1889, are applicable to the conduits to be laid under said permit.

Such a clause fully protects the Company and in no wise weakens the position of the City.
