I respectfully report that the "Standard Hospital" for the cure of the drink habit has been opened at No. 428 E. 22nd Street, in this District and that the same is in charge of Doctors Robert E. Redmond and Thomas McKre, who informed Sergeant Worden that until they pass the State Board of Medical Examiners they have employed Dr. Newton Parr of Govans, Baltimore County, to take charge.

The above as the Sergeant informs me has been done without the assent of the Mayor and City Council, is a violation of the law as contained in or set forth in "Article 16 B.C.C. 1906, Secs. 4 and 5", such violations as therein stated, being finable, at the rate of \$50.00 per day, after notice from the Mayor and Commissioner of Health, to discontinue. The same is therefore respectfully submitted to you for such action, as you may think best to take in the matter.
