Dear Sir:-

The following is a copy of a letter sent to your department concerning the establishment of hospitals:

"Dear Sir:-

The enclosed is a copy of a report made by Capt. J. E. Moxley of the Northern District, which has been sent to this Department, for our consideration. I respectfully call your attention to article 16 of the code of 1906, and especially sections 4 and 5 of that article. Does the so called hospital come under the provisions of article 16?

In this connection, permit me to say that Dr. Robt. E. Redmond called at this office yesterday with a Mr. Thomas who was formerly a member of our Detective force. They desired a permit from this office, and gave me the impression that they had not yet located their hospital. I told them that we had nothing to do with the issuing of the permit, as it came directly under the jurisdiction of the Mayor and City Council. I read them the law of the subject as contained in article 16, and they apparently not being perfectly satisfied, were advised by me to consult a lawyer or to see you, as City Solicitor, concerning their rights in this matter.

Please inform me whether I should take up this report of Capt. Moxley under the provision of Section 5 article 16. By so doing, you will greatly oblige.
