504 Messrs. D. V. Ault & Company have referred to us all the correspondence and data relating to the matter of No. 104 S. Duncan alley in connection with the work being done under Contract No. 53, all of which we have examined carefully in connection with Section 49, page 16 of the General Specifications, and we hasten to assure you that Messrs. D. V. Ault & Company desire to fully recognize and live up to all obligations resting upon them in the matter. There are, however, certain circumstances surrounding the matter which we feel sure have not been brought to your attention, and we would ask that you take the matter up with us on Monday at some hour agreeable to you to the end that appropriate action may be taken in the premises by Messrs. D. V. Ault & Company. Meantime, we would ask that you suspend the forty-eight hour notice sent to our clients this morning to the effect that the repair work in question be begun by them not later than Tuesday noon, 11th inst.
