I have discussed with Mr. Poe the question of necessity for an Ordinance authorizing expenditures to be made by the "Commission on City Plan", in preparing a Plan for the Jones's Falls Improvement.

Mr. Poe has reached the conclusion that the Ordinance of Estimates does not authorize the Commission to expend any part of the money appropriated out of the Jones's Falls Loan, prior to approval of a Plan by the City Council.
