The Ordinance of Estimates for 1911, under the head of "Estimates for New Improvements", appropriates from the Park Tax Fund for general new improvements \$110,167.07.

In my opinion, therefore, the four hundred dollars required to make up the difference between the price that the purchaser is asking and the amount available from one of the Park Loans can properly be taken from the Park Tax Fund.

Dear Sir:-

It appears to me that the sidewalk on the north side of Hamburg street, which is now 13 feet wide, should be narrowed to 10 feet, thereby giving about eighteen foot driveway, sufficient for two teams to pass conveniently between the new curbs, as proposed, and the sidewall of the viaduct carrying Hamburg street over the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Tracks. Could I make this change without having a special ordinance passed?
