The remainder of Section 38G merely relates to the machinery for the collection and for enforcing the collection from the City or from the Counties of the amount due thereunder and is not germane to the question we are now considering, as the City is prepared to pay whatever is properly and justly due from it.

The City will have discharged its full obligation to the State so soon as it pays on each and every City patient a proportionate part of one hundred dollars, calculated from the 8th day of April, 1910, to the 31st day of December, 1910.

The State cannot be asked to receive from the City anything less than this amount, and it is not at liberty, under the law, to demand from the City anything in excess thereof.
