Dear Dr. Bosley:-

9849 My sister-in-law, Mrs. Thomas B. Harrison, is very much interested in the Children's Country Hospital-School, which has recently obtained an option on property in the annex. The question is whether or not the Hospital-School is a "hospital for the sick" within the meaning of Article 16, Section 4 of Pielert's Code of 1906. If it is, an Ordinance is necessary before it can be established; otherwise, I understand that an ordinance is not necessary. I will be very much obliged if you will kindly refer this letter to the City Solicitor for an opinion upon the point, and I will thank you to do this as soon as possible, as the option only runs for sixty days, as should the City Solicitor decide that an ordinance is necessary, it will be necessary for us to act promptly. The facts are as follows -
