I write in reply to your favor of the 20th ultimo, with which you enclosed a letter from the Harbor Engineer to you.

In answering the inquiries of the Harbor Engineer, I shall, for the purpose of convenience, depart, to some extent, from the order of his questions. I shall take up first the question as to whether or not the Plans which may be adopted by the Harbor Board and approved by the Board of Estimates, must subsequently be submitted to the City Council for an Ordinance.
