Dear Sir:

I beg to reply to your communication of the 13th inst., referring to me the question as to whether or not credit should be given Frank J. Lamotte on account of taxes paid in Baltimore City against a bill rendered for the quarter beginning February 11th, 1911, for tuition in the public schools of Baltimore City.

Mr. Lamotte claims to be a holder of one-fourth of the capital stock of the Rice & Hutchins Baltimore Co. and states that the City Tax Bill of such Company for 1911 was \$2,487.50, one-quarter of which bill he regards as having been paid by himself.

His certificate of stock bears date May 1, 1910, but was not delivered to him until after January 1, 1911.
