Dear Sir:

The railing around Druid Lake was damaged on September 4th
072 last by automobile No. 19283 owned by J. Brian, 3rd, of Pumphrey,

Md. According to the best information I have on this subject, this
machine was being driven by Phillip Freeman, colored, 1919 Brunt
street, who was instructing David Flax of 2047 Pennsylvania avenue
how to run the machine. The amount of the damage to the railing
was \$24.75.

There were no witnesses to the accident other than the two
men mentioned as being in the machine at the time. Mess. Babby and
Bear, attorneys, for Mr. Brian, state that, in their judgment, he is
not responsible for the damage and refuses to pay the bill. They
base their opinion upon their statement that Mr. Brian was in a hos-
pital at the time of the accident and that the machine was being used
without his authority.

Will you kindly advise me whether Mr. Brian is responsible
for this bill; and if not, to whom we shall look for payment.
